MY BIOGRAPHY

After our marriage, my husband Hans D. Baumann and I emigrated in 1958 from our native Germany to the United States and settled for the next 5 years in Massachusetts, where our two children were born.

In 1963 we moved to Illinois, and from 1966 we lived for 2 years in France, before returning to Massachusetts.

In January1977 we moved to New Hampshire, where my husband and I started the H. D. Baumann Valve Manufacturing Co., which later became internationally renown in the industry. In 2000 I accompanied our Team to Toulouse, France, for the World Aerobatic Championships. (helped to organize and interpret). In June/July 2003 I volunteered again at the WAC in Lakeland, FL. I am past Vice Pres. of IAC Chapter 97, and am a current member of AFS in Mass.
