Cirrus Aircraft announced more progress toward certification of its \$1.96 million, seven-seat personal jet on Nov. 26. The second certification flight test aircraft logged its first flight Nov. 25 out of Duluth International Airport, and company officials said that 45-minute sortie was a smooth one.

The first SF50 Vision jet used for FAA certification testing began flying in March, and has since logged nearly 220 hours over 150 flights. A third flight test model is being built, and will join the testing fleet "in the near future," the company announced in a press release. Cirrus hopes to have certification complete and deliveries commenced by the end of 2015.

Cirrus had collected about 550 deposits as of July, and expects to build 90 in 2016, ramping up to 125 finished aircraft in 2017. The company is setting up a flight training and mentorship program for pilots, promising an intuitive transition for those familiar with piston aircraft including the Cirrus SR20 and SR22 models that have logged more than 6 million flight hours in a fleet of 5,000 aircraft delivered. The SF50 is expected to deliver performance that bridges the gap between high-performance propeller-driven aircraft and light jets, cruising at 300 knots at 28,000 feet with a 1,000-nautical-mile range. The company has posted additional details and specifications on its website.

The SF50 will accommodate up to five adults and two smaller passengers, and will be fitted with the same ballistic parachute system standard on all Cirrus aircraft and credited by Cirrus with saving nearly 100 lives in the SR-series fleet.

The second conforming SF50 personal jet lifts off on a test flight.

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The 2015 Red Bull Air Race World Championship will feature two new stops in Japan and Russia, organizers announced this week. Red Bull will hold eight races and start its tour on Feb. 13 in Abu Dhabi, where the series launched its 2014 season. New venues will be in Chiba, Japan, May 16-17 and Sochi, Russia, May 30-31. FAA Allows Expanded Simulator Training

Pilots now can log more simulator time toward an instrument rating, under a new rule published by the FAA on Wednesday. A rule issued in 2009 had placed a 10-hour limit on the training devices, but the FAA said since technology has advanced and simulators are more realistic, pilots now can log up to 20 hours in an approved advanced aviation training device. The 10-hour limit will still apply for the use of basic devices.

New NOTAM Search Features Now Available

To help pilots streamline their search for Notices to Airmen (NOTAMs) during flight planning, the FAA rolled out some new search features now available at http://notams.aim.faa.gov/notamSearch/. Among the new features is a "search by flight path" capability that allows pilots to see NOTAMS that apply only to the route they custom select using airports, navigational aids, named fixes, and/or route/airway designators to define a flight path. That flight path width can also be adjusted from one to 125 nautical miles on each side and NOTAMs for up to five alternate airports can also be included. The "search by free text" feature allows you to search for NOTAMs based on a keyword, airport designator, NOTAM number or scenario. Search results can also be custom sorted by location, number, class, start and end dates, and condition. Users can also export search results to a Microsoft Excel or Adobe PDF document. Additional enhancements to search capability are expected in the near future.

For more on how to use the search function, click the "help" button at the top right of the NOTAM Search home page to access a user's guide. Feedback is also encouraged to help make improvements. Next to the help link is a feedback button where you can submit comments.
