Notes from the President:

Hey All,

It's been a couple busy and cold months. Progress on the Zenith 750 has been slow but advances have been made! The two big things I've been working on are the nose gear suspension upgrade and the O-200 exhaust. Zenith released a much improved nose gear suspension system for their line of 750/650 aircraft. Since the introduction of the Zenith 701 in 1986 they have relied on a bungee for nose landing gear suspension and that design has followed through until recently in the 750 series aircraft. While light, dead simple and reliable customers wanted more. The Viking engine company came up with a steel spring replacement that brought a few followers but didn't seem to gather much steam.

Late this last year Zenith debuted a new shock disc (to use Mooney terms) suspension. This system uses a stack of ten silicone rubber donuts (my favorite term) with aluminum spacers in between. From all accounts from those who have installed and tested it say it's a great upgrade. The rudder forces are now light and in line with the other controls. The ground steering is easier and nose suspension movement has a hydraulically damped feel. The only downside of the new system is you will gain three pounds over the bungee system. I think I gained at least that over the last holiday.

The new exhaust for my O-200 will be built "in-house" out of 304 Stainless Steel and be a two into one on each side. Much deliberation went into building a crossover exhaust but my research shows it helps very little for this engine. I will have the two muffs needed for cabin and carb heat with provisions of adding a muffler down the road if I can't keep it quiet enough. More to come on this project.

This month I will be at Altus AFB in Oklahoma celebrating the arrival of their new KC-46A tankers and Vice-President John Ricciotti will be taking the lead of our meeting. It's time to start planning Young Eagles events for the New Year.

FAA Reports Successful ADS-B Rebate Relaunch

The FAA reports that its rebates are quickly being claimed by general aviation owners equipping their aircraft with Automatic Dependent Surveillance - Broadcast avionics. A month after the FAA relaunched its \$500 rebate program, 1,438 rebates have been taken from a total of 9,792 available through October 11, 2019, as long as supplies last. Thirty to forty rebates are claimed on an average day. The FAA relaunched the program to encourage owners of fixed-wing, single-engine piston aircraft to equip with ADS-B Out avionics, which will be required in certain, controlled airspace beginning January 1, 2020, which is less than 14 months from now.

Aircraft Owners need to follow five steps to receive the \$500 rebate:

- 1. Purchase the equipment and schedule its installation.
- 2. Obtain a Rebate Reservation Code by reserving a position online.
- 3. Have the equipment installed.
- 4. Conduct the required equipment performance validation and get an Incentive Code.
- 5. Claim the \$500 rebate online using the Rebate Reservation Code and Incentive Code.

As with the earlier rebate program, the relaunched rebate program is available only to those who have not yet equipped their aircraft. In addition to the ADS-B Rebate reservation portal, the FAA's Equip ADS-B website lists FAA-certified ADS-B equipment and features an equipage database searchable by aircraft type and model.
